#### 2.1 Intended use of the RM

- for laboratory use only
- calibration of analytical instruments

#### 2.2 Instruction for the correct use of the RM

The ampoules should be stored at -20°C in a dark place. Before usage of the RM, the ampoules should be allowed to warm to room temperature. The recommended minimum sub-sample amount for all kinds of application is 100  $\mu$ L. The expiry date of this RM is based on the current knowledge and holds only for proper storage conditions in the originally closed flasks/packages.

#### 2.3 Hazardous situation

The normal laboratory safety precautions should be observed when working with this RM. Further details for the handling of this RM are available as safety data sheet (SDS).

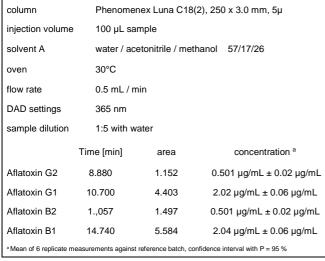

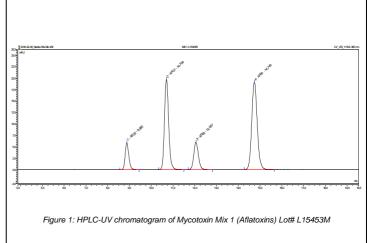
## 4. Discussion of traceability

This calibrant is certified on the basis of gravimetric preparation [5]. Thus the certified values (mass concentrations of 4 different Aflatoxins) are based on the weighed amount of the starting materials and are therefore traceable to the stated purity of the solid raw materials. High purity materials represent a practical realization of concentration units, through conversion of mass to molar quantity.

## 5. Confirmation of certified value by HPLC-UV

The certified concentrations of the 4 different Aflatoxins of the gravimetric prepared solution were confirmed by HPLC-UV against an independently prepared reference batch (Biopure Lot# L15153M).
